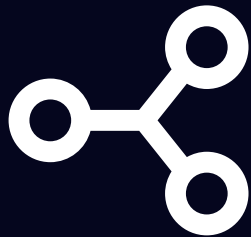

Those responsible for agency recruitment strategies and management, educators of high school and college career programs, leaders of youth programs (Explorers, PSC or agency), those responsible for paid and unpaid agency intern and cadet programs.

- Opportunities to participate in targeted discussion forums dealing with pipeline development issues and lead by practitioners and leaders in the field
- A reference guide on recruitment pipelines with examples of current programs
- Ways to make known your agency to youth in career programs nationwide and make contact with those youth
- Lesson plans and ways to have youth in your programs receive skill certifications.

Building the Pipeline - Long Term Recruitment Strategies for Public Safety Careers

Presentations, panels, brainstorming, and problem-solving sessions focused on sharing best practices as well as collaboration on strategies for both growing your own and attracting youth from other locations. Those involved in recruitment, school instructors, public safety youth program leaders and work-based learning coordinators from school systems will also participate.

The Youth Preparation

Public Safety Cadets, Explorers Posts, and programs unique to departments will be present and have sessions. There will also be sessions on how to implement, grow, and improve such offerings. Some sessions in the education track would be appropriate for youth program advisors in improving designing content and activities at youth meetings.

Educational Programs Track

This track is the traditional LAPSEN national conference track. Sessions on high school and technical college programs, SkillsUSA, pathway design, teaching strategies and other content relevant to those working with students in educational settings. All pathways are invited to attend: law enforcement, fire, EMT, legal, forensics, drones, dispatch, corrections, and security.
